## ST ANDREWS WEST SANDS

Famous for the opening scenes of the film Chariots of Fire, West Sands is almost 2 miles of sandy beach. Voted "Scotland's Beach Award" for 29 consecutive years. Take a walk along the beach and head to the Eden Estuary Nature Reserve, home to birds and seals and a few kite surfers!

The remains of St Andrews Cathedral, which was Scotland's largest cathedral and most magnificent church, show how impressive it used to be. The museum houses an outstanding collection of early and later medieval sculptures and other relics found on the site.

## ST ANDREWS BOTANIC GARDENS

An 18 acre garden located in the centre of St Andrews, this living research and conservation experiment is a beautiful and peaceful place to visit. Lots to see including rock garden, rhododendron glade, pond and pinetum. The garden is home to lots of wildlife too including red squirrels.
